About

This booklet contains the end of year expectations for your child at New Horizon Primary School. These objectives relate directly to the National Curriculum that your child will be covering this year in Maths, Reading and Writing and are the focus of direct teaching. Our curriculum maps and subject progression models will show how these objectives are implemented in the classroom.

Maths:

Number and place Value 12 34:

- Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, starting from any number
- Read and write numbers to **100** in numerals
- Count in multiples of 2, 5, and 10
- Identify 1 more and 1 less than a given number
- Use language like equal to, more than, less than, most, least
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in words

Addition and Subtraction + -:

- Know number bonds to **20** and related subtraction facts
- Add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero
- Solve **one-step problems** using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and missing number problems

Multiplication and Division **X ÷**:

• Solve **one-step problems** involving multiplication and division using objects, pictures, and arrays (with teacher support)

Fractions ::

- Recognise, find, and name:
- 1/2 as one of two equal parts
- 1/4 as one of four equal parts of an object, shape, or quantity

Measurement \square.:

- Compare, describe, and solve problems involving:
 - Length/height (e.g. long/short, double/half)
 - Mass/weight (e.g. heavy/light)
 - o **Capacity/volume** (e.g. full/empty, half full)
 - Time (e.g. quicker/slower, earlier/later)
- Tell the time to the hour and half past
- Recognise and know the value of coins and notes
- Sequence events using time language (e.g. before/after, today/tomorrow)

Geometry **\(\rightarrow**:

- Recognise and name 2-D shapes (e.g. rectangles, circles, triangles)
- Recognise and name **3-D shapes** (e.g. cubes, spheres, pyramids)
- Describe **position**, **direction**, **and movement**, including whole, half, quarter, and three-quarter turns

Reading

Word Reading abc :

- Apply **phonic knowledge** to decode regular and unfamiliar words
- Read words with common suffixes like -s, -es, -ing, -ed, -est
- Read words with contractions (e.g. I'm, don't) and understand the apostrophe
- Read common exception words (e.g. said, they, once, school)
- Read pseudo (alien) words to demonstrate phonics understanding
- Blend sounds in unfamiliar words and divide words into syllables

Comprehension :

- Listen to and discuss a wide range of stories, poems, and non-fiction texts
- Retell familiar stories using narrative language
- Make predictions based on what has been read
- Link reading to personal experiences
- Recognise and join in with **predictable phrases**
- Learn and recite simple poems and rhymes by heart
- Begin to make **inferences** from text and illustrations
- Re-read texts to build **fluency and confidence**
- Read aloud with **pace and expression**, pausing at punctuation

Reading Behaviours :

- Show pleasure and motivation in reading
- Self-correct when reading doesn't make sense
- Discuss the significance of titles and events
- Recognise features of fiction and non-fiction texts
- Talk about favourite books and authors

Writing

Composition:

- Say out loud what they're going to write before writing it
- Compose and sequence simple sentences to form short narratives
- Re-read writing to check it makes sense and make changes if needed
- Discuss writing with teachers or peers
- · Read aloud their writing clearly

Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation ★:

- Use capital letters, full stops, question marks, and exclamation marks mostly correctly
- Use the joining word "and" to link ideas
- Begin to use adjectives to describe
- Use simple sentence structures
- Use **prefixes** (e.g. un- in unhappy) and **suffixes** (e.g. -ing, -ed, -er, -est)
- Spell most common exception words and days of the week accurately

Handwriting :

- Sit correctly at a table and hold a pencil properly
- Form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place
- Form capital letters and digits 0-9 correctly
- Leave spaces between words
- Begin to understand letter families (e.g. letters formed in similar ways).
