



Dear Parents/Carers,

I wanted to write to assure you that the Academy your child attends – and indeed all schools within Thinking Schools Academy Trust – is continuing to follow the latest advice from the Government and Public Health England (PHE) to help ensure the health and wellbeing of our whole school community. This is, as always, our top priority.

We currently have no specific concerns about anyone within our school community in relation to Coronavirus (COVID-19) and the Academy remains open as usual, as advised by the Government and confirmed as the guidance again yesterday afternoon by the Prime Minister.

All school closure decisions will ultimately be taken by the CEO but we will co-ordinate this decision with the school and local authority, and will of course again follow Government and PHE advice and guidance.

In preparation for full or partial closures I would like to provide you with a summary on what we will do to enable pupils to access learning materials:

These materials can be accessed through downloading and printing if this is available to you, or by working with them on screen and a note pad and pen/pencil. We will be providing a range of different materials and recommendations to support the children to continue to learn.

Most year groups are also able to access TT Rock Stars and Spelling Shed as electronic apps/ web based programmes.

Children are expected to continue with their daily reading practice as well as learning spellings and recalling their basic number facts and times tables.

You may also be aware the Government issued updated guidance in other areas, which we are taking heed of and following. Now, should your child exhibit even mild signs of Covid-19, which has been defined as a new, continuous cough or high temperature, you should ensure they self-isolate for a period of 7 days. Our staff have been advised that they must do the same. Based on the new advice, while our schools remain open, we are going to defer all school trips- there will be further communication from the office regarding this in due course.

We should all of course be extra vigilant and responsible, and we are encouraging the whole school community to continue to take the additional precautions that has been the case for several days now, including maintaining high levels of personal hygiene, regularly washing hands and following the *Catch it, Bin it, Kill it* advice when sneezing or coughing. As you would expect, we already promote these practices within school and we would appreciate your support in continuing to encourage the same at home.

Anyone returning from the identified countries of concern and experiencing specific health concerns, related symptoms or with general medical enquiries should contact 111 and not visit their local GP Surgery or A&E.
